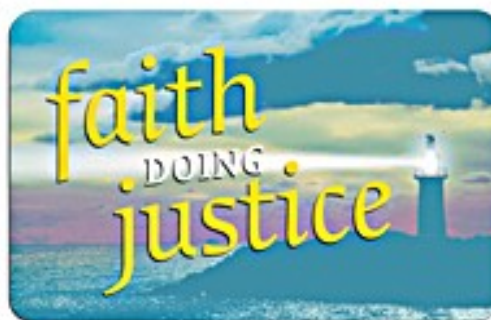
- A quick overview of Catholic teaching on social justice
