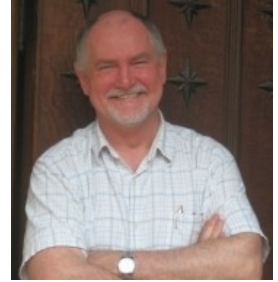


## Jesuits & Justice
